Beloved, Be-Loved

The month of February is dedicated to the Holy Family. They exemplify the perfect definition of love. We also celebrate the Feast of St. Valentines. He was the patron Saint of love. One of the best words in the Bible is the word beloved. "See what kind of love the Father has given to us that we should be called children of God; and so we are. The reason why the world does not know us is that it did not know Him. Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like Him, because we shall see Him as He is. Everyone who has this hope based on Him makes himself pure, as He is pure." 1 John 3:1-3.

God is trying to teach us about His kind of love in the Bible. Often one of the hardest things for a person to do is to accept unconditional love. Perhaps it is because the world is so empty of that kind of love. The world often displays a love that is contingent on the recipient's behavior or form of repayment of the love. It is a give and take kind of love...a "you scratch my back, I'll scratch yours" kind of trade-off for love. Sadly, many marriages share this kind of conditional love, where spouses agree to love each other as long as they are given equal or greater love in exchange. It is about themselves and selfishness.

The word beloved means "dearly loved, esteemed, favorite, worthy of love". It's a word indicating an action on the part of the one doing the loving. Love could be explained as wanting the best for someone, and that's exactly what God intends for us. God loves you simply because he loves you. You don't have to work for his affection. You don't have to set yourself straight before God can pour out his love over you. The God, whose love is so great for

us that he sent his only Son to die that we might live through him, has chosen to love us, not because of who we are, but because of who He is. Our role in this is to BE-LOVED. Sometimes we struggle to accept that kind of unconditional love.


Perhaps certain circumstances of your life, such as your childhood, your family, your friends, your health, your job, etc. has caused you to question God's love. Take some time to read Job Chapters 38-42. Job was experiencing more heartache than any person should ever experience and he was questioning his situation and ultimately God's love for him at the time. God answers his dilemma. It's a challenging and encouraging read. We all have our Job moments in a sense, maybe not to his extreme circumstances.

We may never fully comprehend the love of God, but we can be encouraged that we have been called "beloved" and we can anticipate learning about and receiving more of His kind of love. Meditate on the thought that your role in this life is to "be-loved"! If only we could grasp that thought, it would calm so many anxious thoughts. He often lets his beloved suffer, to take up their cross and we can't see why. We can just know He knows the why and it is all allowed to happen because He loves us. God is not

an angry taskmaster who shows affection only when you succeed. He is a loving Father who will always love vou no matter what. Take time to receive the depth of his love for you today. Allow his love to heal you, transform you, free you, and lead you to the abundant life he has always longed to give. Read, meditate and pray over these Bible verses about God's love as you walk in faith today.

She was born in the Sudan and was captured by Arab slave traders and was treated poorly by her captors and eventual master. She found her way into Italy and was made aware of the Catholic Faith. She was told by her mother that there is a god out there who created everything and loves

her. She discovered the God who loves her through the Son of God, Jesus Christ. She is quoted as saying: Seeing the sun, the moon and the stars, I said to myself, 'Who could be the Master of these beautiful things?' I felt a great desire to see him, to know him and to pay him homage. She joined an



order of religious sisters and died in 1947. Another quote from St. Josephine shows her forgiveness and her desire for saving souls. If I were to meet the slave-traders who kidnapped me and even those who tortured me, I would kneel and kiss their hands, for if that did not happen, I would not be a Christian and Religious today... The Lord has loved me so much: we must love everyone... we must be compassionate! St. Josephine Bakhita, pray for us.

Continue to pray for me as I pray for you.

This article contains examples and quotes about overcoming fear. It is recommended that throughout the month you meditate on the words which resonate with you.


- Regarding political correctness –When we stand before Jesus at the end of our life, if all the people on earth thought we were wrong or evil, and Jesus alone knew we were right, we will hear the words, "well done good and faithful servant; enter into my kingdom." THE JUST WILL BE VINDICATED.
- Rudolf Hess, the commandant of Auschwitz responsible for the murder of 3 million people was powerful for a few years. Just moments before he was to be executed, he realized that his house of Nazism was built on sand. He called for a priest and confessed his horrible sins. You will have inner security all the days of your life and at the time of death if, as Jesus recommends, you "BUILD YOUR HOUSE ON ROCK."
- Consider the humble courage of Mother Teresa at a national event with the pro-abortion president Bill Clinton in the front row. She spoke of the tremendous evil of abortion. The little one facing the powerful. How she pleased the heart of Jesus. "IN WEAKNESS THERE IS STRENGTH."

Many of the following are TRUISMS FOR REFLECTION. These truisms are taken from evangelical writer John Maxwell's book, The Difference





Padre Pio considered his hospital to be his work. He even named his hospital 'The Home for the Relief of Suffering.' He said that God would bless those who bless his work. He had many obstacles along the way. Padre Pio, on the day of the hospital's opening on May 5, 1956 stated, "A seed has been sown on the earth that will warm with the rays of His love. A new army made of sacrifices and love will rise in God's glory and comfort the souls and bodies of the sick." On the first anniversary of the hospital's opening, May 5, 1957, Padre Pio again stated, "In the House for the Relief of the Suffering we pray constantly for the Pope."

The sick have much to offer. In many ways they are the Church's most powerful army. Please know that your suffering is precious and needed for the Church. Fulton Sheen said that the greatest tragedy is wasted suffering. It is critical that you not only pray for the Pope, but for all the needs of the Church and world. Your prayers, united to your suffering, are precious treasures and

gems in the sight of God. Pope Paul VI said on May 5, 1966, the tenth anniversary of the inauguration of the Casa Sollievo della Sofferenza, "The almighty and merciful Lord, who accepts for Himself every benefit given to his suffering brothers, will repay them many fold with generous measures and great abundance." The Pope's words echo Padre Pio's words when the Padre said, "God will bless those who bless my work."

When you offer up your suffering and give from the treasures of your pain, rest assured that God will abundantly bless you for your selflessness. Our yearly donation to the Headquarters of the Padre Pio Prayer Group in San Giovanni Rotondo goes to support the Casa Sollievo dell Sofferenza Hospital. Supporting Catholic Health Care was one of St. Pio of Pietrelcina's passions. Let us pray for all of the Catholic professionals treating the sick and dying with love and compassion as Jesus does

With what great love you must have watched over the infant Church and what motherly solicitude encouraged the apostles as they committed themselves to carry on the work of Your Divine Son on earth.


Make the Church ever to be the sign and instrument of intimate union with God.

gathering. We will start the consecration on February 16. On the Feast of St. Joseph, March 19, we will have a Mass and consecration; St. Joseph's Table will follow.



For February, I am writing about Blessed Tommaso Maria Fusco. He was the founder of

many orphanages and the Daughters of Charity of the Most Precious Blood. Blessed Tommaso Maria Fusco was born on December I, 1831, in

Pagani, Salerno, Italy, to Dr. Antonio Fusco and Stella Giordano and the very same day he was Baptized at the Church of S. Felice e Corpo di Cristo. He grew up in a very religious and charitable home. His parents instilled in him a love for God and the poor. In 1837, when Tommaso was six years old his mother died of cholera, and a few years later in 1841, his father died too. One of Tommaso's paternal uncles took care of him and provided him with education. Saint Alphonsus Liguori was Canonized in 1839 and his story inspired little Tommaso. Tommaso wanted to become like Saint Alphonsus Liguori and to become a Priest.

Tommaso entered the Diocesan Seminary in 1847 and he was ordained to the Holy Priesthood in 1855. By then, he lost many of his relatives, but he did not lose hope. Father Tommaso united his sufferings to Christ Crucified. Father Tommaso was a skilled speaker and had the gift of touching hearts. He encouraged people to embrace a life of Prayer and zeal for the Gospel. He felt the call to further evangelize, so he entered the

Missionaries of Nocera and spent many years wandering, preaching, and instructing priests. Father Tommaso had a special love for the Sacrament of Confession. He also founded the Congregation of the Daughters of Charity of the Most Precious Blood to care for poor girls and opened an orphanage. On February 24, 1891, Father Tommaso Maria Fusco died of liver disease. His Holiness, Pope Saint John Paul II Beatified Father Tommaso Maria Fusco on October 7, 2001.

Blessed Tommaso Maria Fusco is a great model for priests. Through his zealous and selfless service, he was able to bring many souls to God. Even though his life was full of suffering, he never let it get the best of him, he knew that God had a purpose for him and would take care of him. Blessed Tommaso Maria Fusco gave hope to people when they were suffering, and may we, during February, be like Blessed Tommaso Maria Fusco and be people of hope.
